Remembering Kroening's Garage

“Hey Mom!” “Where’s Dad?” “He went up to Ed’s” (Kroening’s). I heard that many times. When I asked my Aunt Carol Bohl Pfohl, she said, “Oh, shucks!” Every time I turned around, somebody was asking me to pick them up at Kroening’s because they had to leave their car or truck there to be fixed.

If only I had asked Ed’s daughter, Gladys. She died recently at the age of 99. She would have been able to tell about having her wedding reception with Ben Haseley in the garage. The meal of the day was a chicken dinner, and they found chicken bones in the corners for weeks after.

Granddaughter Donna Licursi remembered sitting in the big old yellow rocker in the corner of the front room and hoping that when Grandpa came out, he would give her a chocolate bar from the glass display counter, and maybe, if she was lucky, even a bottle of Coke. I sometimes tagged along with Dad and remember sitting in the rocker when Ed’s wife, Helen, brought over a plateful of cookies.

Paul Haseley remembers buying a U.S. Motor Atlas from the glass case where Ed wrote out the bills. Paul still has that atlas. My brother, Don Haseley, remembers the barrels of nuts and bolts back in the machine shop.

Ed Kroening began the garage and gas station on Route 31 in the 1930’s. He also sold cars there. Ed and his first wife, Edna, had three children, Harold, Gladys and Richard. Edna tragically died of pneumonia after giving birth to Richard, who died shortly thereafter. The obituary states that the funeral was the largest that the St. Peter’s Walmore community had ever seen. Son Harold served in the Army in World War II. After he returned to the U.S. he worked in the garage until he retired in 1985.

Ed remarried, and he and his wife, Helen, had two more children, Gilbert and Sharon. Gilbert taught at Niagara Wheatfield and also worked at the garage for many years. Ed owned and operated the garage for 49 years until he died in 1974.

Imagine all the great conversations and jokes that were told throughout the years as Sanborn townspeople and customers from all over brought their vehicles to be repaired at Kroening’s Garage!
